Teaching Excellence Fundamentals [TEF01]

Build your foundation in evidence-based teaching practices. Whether you're new to higher education or looking to refresh your approach, this badge introduces core principles that distinguish exceptional educators. You'll explore how kindness, engagement, and understanding of learning can transform your classroom.

Featured Learning:

- Introduction To A Pedagogy Of Kindness (Cate Denial) COURSE A pedagogy of kindness seeks to re-orientate the educator-student relationship based on trust, creating the conditions to get the best from students.
- <u>Helping Students Learn How to Learn</u> (Todd Zakrajsek) COURSE We don't tend to explain to students how learning takes place, but a short intervention on this topic can have significant, lasting, long-term benefits.
- <u>Learning Styles: Understanding the Myth and the Opportunity</u> (Todd D. Zakrajsek) WEBINAR RECORDING Todd explored the persistence of the learning styles myth, challenged its effectiveness, and suggested evidence-based alternatives for effective teaching practices.
- Promoting Growth-Minded Students and Faculty (Todd D. Zakrajsek) WEBINAR RECORDING Todd
 D. Zakrajsek discusses actions educators can take to model a growth mindset for students and
 continually improve their teaching.
- <u>Academic Integrity In The Hybrid World</u> (Tricia Bertram Gallant) COURSE In this course you will learn about strategies to improve academic integrity and reduce cheating in your classroom.

Intentional Teaching Techniques for Better Learning [ITTBL01]

Ground your teaching in solid research. This badge connects you with the science of learning through practical applications of cognitive research. You'll learn evidence-based techniques that enhance learning, memory, understanding, and skill development.

- <u>Small Teaching: Retrieval</u> (James M. Lang) COURSE In this course you will learn about the importance of retrieval practice for your students and how to implement it into your teaching.
- <u>Small Teaching: Predicting</u> (Todd Zakrajsek, James M. Lang) COURSE The act of making predictions activates prior knowledge and deepens learning. In this course, we will look at ways you can embed prediction into your classes, whether in person or online.

- <u>Small Teaching: Interleaving</u> (Todd Zakrajsek, James M. Lang) COURSE -Interleaving the spacing out and mixing up of learning activities over time promotes long-term knowledge retention. In this course, we look at how you can interleave within a unit of study, across a module and an entire course to maximize impact on student learning.
- <u>Small Teaching: Learning Through Connecting</u> (Flower Darby, James M. Lang) COURSE One of the things that distinguishes an expert from a novice is the density of connections between facts, concepts and skills. This course explores how we can help students make those connections that deepen understanding.
- <u>Small Teaching: Learning Through Practicing</u> (Flower Darby, James M. Lang) COURSE Becoming an expert takes practice, and it also means responding to feedback. In this course, we look at how to take create moments for students to practice skills in ways that will benefit from your expert observations.
- <u>Small Teaching: Self-Explaining</u> (Derek Bruff, James M. Lang) COURSE Self explaining, or explaining to others, helps students process, rehearse and reinforce their learning, and it can be easily incorporated into face-to-face and online classes.

Student Engagement Strategies [SES01] Explorer Badge

Create learning experiences that captivate and motivate. This badge equips you with proven strategies to boost student engagement across different learning environments. You'll learn to facilitate meaningful discussions and handle challenging conversations with confidence.

- An Overview Of Classroom Engagement (Erik Blair) COURSE Classroom engagement centers on building positive interactions between students and learning activities, their fellow students, and educators. This course explores the principles of classroom engagement and some approaches to help you get started.
- <u>Teaching By Discussion</u> (Jay Howard) COURSE Effective classroom discussion is rarely a product of chance. In this course, we look at techniques we can employ to increase the effectiveness of our classroom discussions and improve student outcomes.
- <u>Thinking Differently About 'Quiet' Students</u> (Todd Zakrajsek) TOP TIPS In this video Todd Zakrajsek
 explores why students may hesitate to speak in class and shares strategies for fostering inclusive,
 flexible participation.
- <u>3 Techniques For Engaging Students In The Classroom</u> (James M. Lang) TOP TIPS In this short video James M Lang shares three simple strategies that will help effectively engage and improve student attention during your presentation.

- Four Ideas For Checking In (Maha Bali, Mia Zamora) ACTIVITY Ideas for checking in with your students at the beginning of any class, in person or online.
- What to Include in Your Welcome Letter to Students (Niya Bond) TOP TIPS In this video, Niya Bond shares tips on what to include in a welcome letter to your students on the first day or week of class.
- <u>Developing a Pre-Course Survey</u> (LaKisha Barrett) ACTIVITY To ensure students' success, knowing their names and establishing a connection with them is vital. This can significantly impact their ability to stay engaged and motivated. Conducting pre-course surveys and assessments is an effective way to achieve this goal.
