ACUE - Promoting Active Learning Online

OneHE - Active Learning Implementation [ALI01] Explorer Badge

**Transform your classroom from passive to dynamic.** This badge provides practical strategies for engaging students actively in their learning. You'll discover evidence-based techniques that work across disciplines and learn to overcome common implementation challenges.

- Classroom Practice: Active Learning (Derek Bruff) COURSE Active learning is a technique that enables students to engage with peers and reflect on what they're learning. In this course, we explore how to build active learning activities into time-limited class sessions.
- <u>Leading In-Class Group Work</u> (Derek Bruff) COURSE Group activities can create active learning environments in our teaching. In this course, we explore principles and structures to make inclass group work successful.
- <u>Engaged Lecturing</u> (Todd Zakrajsek) COURSE Lecturing, done well, engages the students in the learning process by stimulating interest in the topic, helping students to retrieve prior knowledge, and encouraging reflection to solidify newly learned information.
- <u>Introduction to Team-Based Learning</u> (Billie Franchini) COURSE In this course, you will explore how Team-Based Learning (TBL) can transform your classroom into an engaging, collaborative environment where students take active responsibility for their learning.

- Improving the Student Experience with Exit Tickets (Karrin Lukacs) COURSE In this course, you'll learn what an Exit Ticket is and how you can use it to create opportunities for students to reflect and to connect, incorporate student voice and choice, and build community.

- <u>Fundamentals of Backward Course Design</u> (Eric Metzler) COURSE In this course, you will learn a systematic procedure for developing courses in which student learning and effort align with the learning outcomes you desire.
- Course Development Made Clear (Chris Hakala) COURSE In this course you will learn the
  process of developing a course from start to finish using principles from the science of learning
  and backwards design.
- <u>Using AI for Course Development: a Chat with Aditi Garg</u> (Aditi Garg and Niya Bond) INTERVIEW AND DEMO -In this video, Aditi Garg from the University of Saskatchewan demonstrates their institutional AI agent, ALDA, designed to help educators create comprehensive and inclusive course outlines.
- An Introduction To Enhancing Academic Integrity (Camilla Roberts) COURSE -Academic integrity is assuring that the work that students do is their own so student learning is authentic, and the system of grades, degrees, and certifications is trusted and robust.
- <u>Designing HyFlex Courses</u> (Brian Beatty) COURSE HyFlex (hybrid-flexible) courses are multimodal courses which offer students the choice of online or classroom-based learning. This course explains the design principles and suggests ways to get started.
